Would we be interested in joining with choir boosters? We understand that choir and theater have joined together. That's where things are right now.

Treasurer Report: Sarah Binkowski: We received one large check. We updated the website with different levels of donors. Michelle has been collecting check and money for spring marching band. We have one student matched with financial aid.

Jen: we are looking to create more of a rolling budget, foreseeing more of our expenses- both regular expenses and miscellaneous. Sarah: the last few years, we have been spending what we've been taking in.

Michelle Kaufman: marching band-for fall, it would be nice to have someone to help, and learn the marching band process. This is optimally a freshman or sophomore parent. As far as the spring, we can look at doing testing once a week. What is the volunteer capacity needed?

Alan: it's nice to have parents there, so we don't have to pull staff off the field if there is an issue. Passing t-shirts out on April 16.
